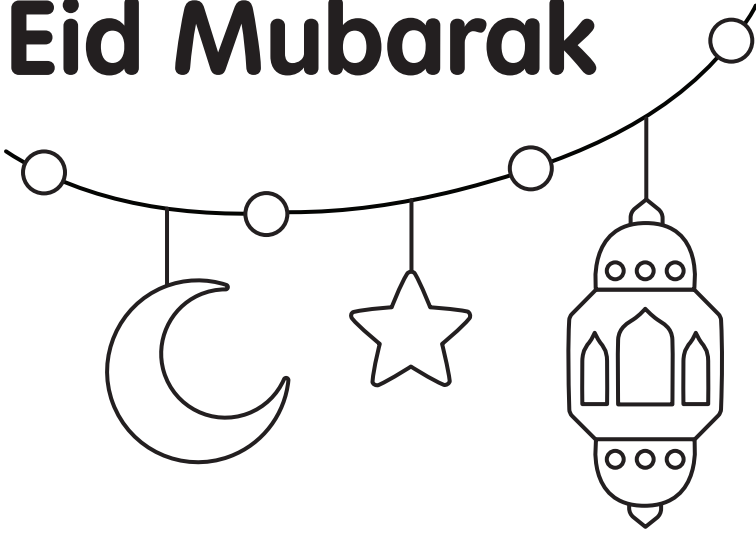

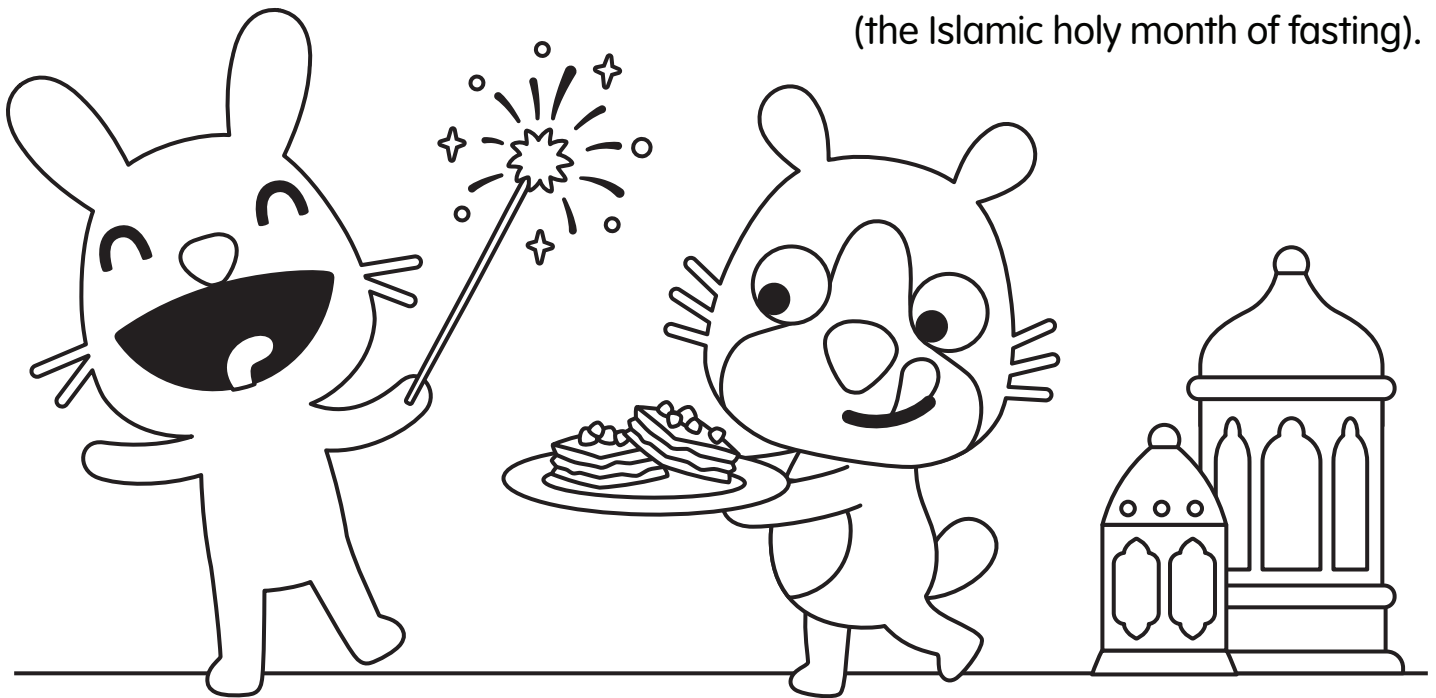

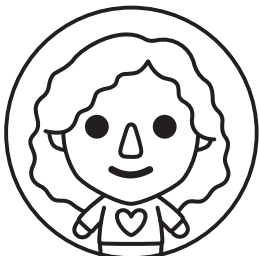

# DIY Hanging Decoration

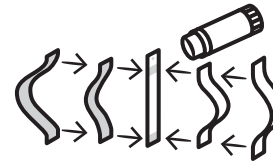
Make your own ornament to help decorate for Eid! Print multiple sheets for more ornaments.

## Instructions



### 1. Color and cut

Color in the strips and cut out along the dotted lines.



### 2. Assemble lantern

Glue the ends of the strips to the center strip with the longest on the outside.



### 3. Add string and hang

Tie a string to the top hole of the middle strip and hang to display!
