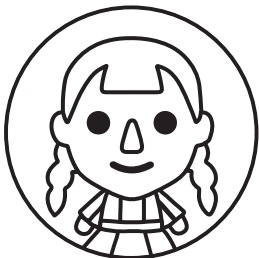

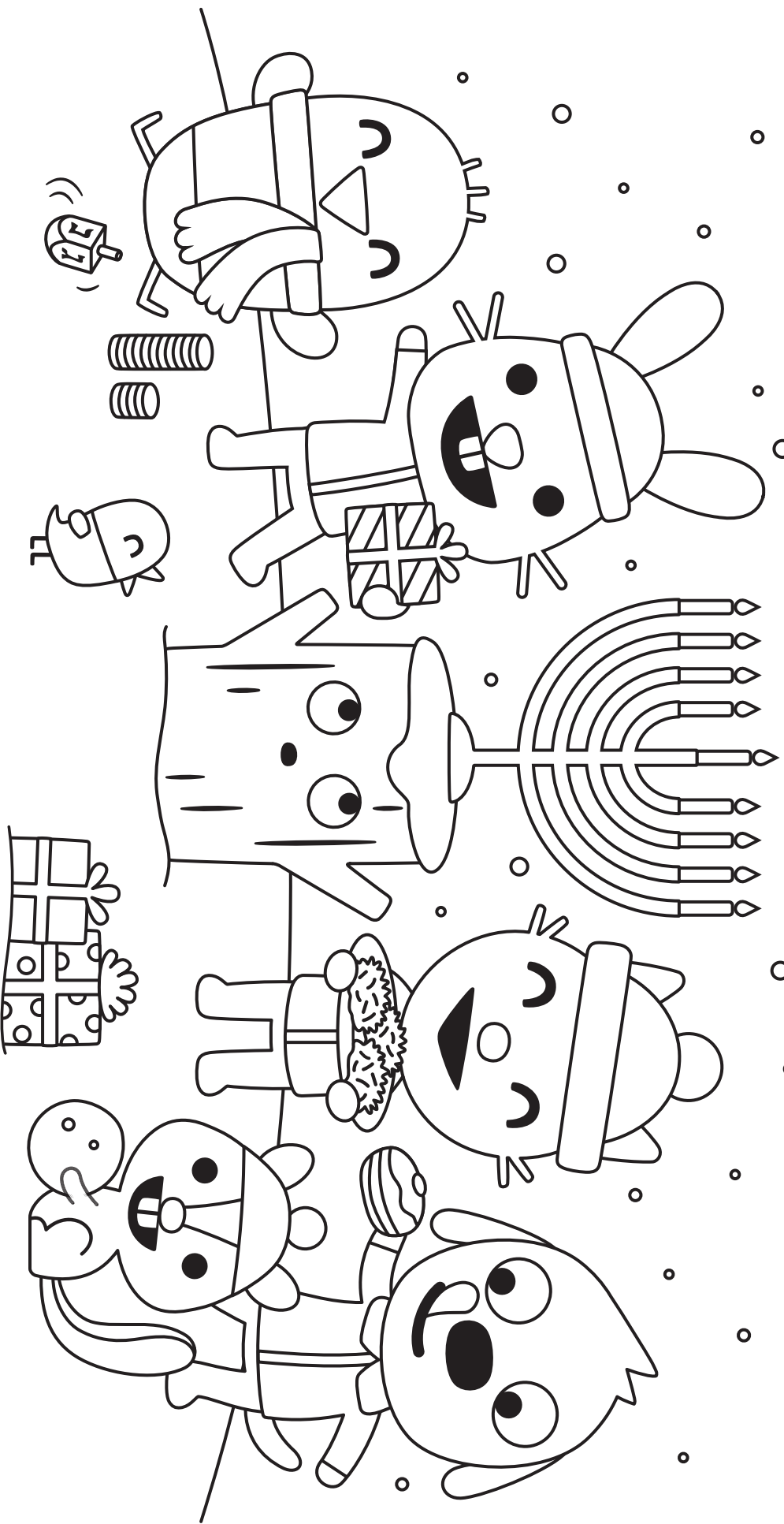

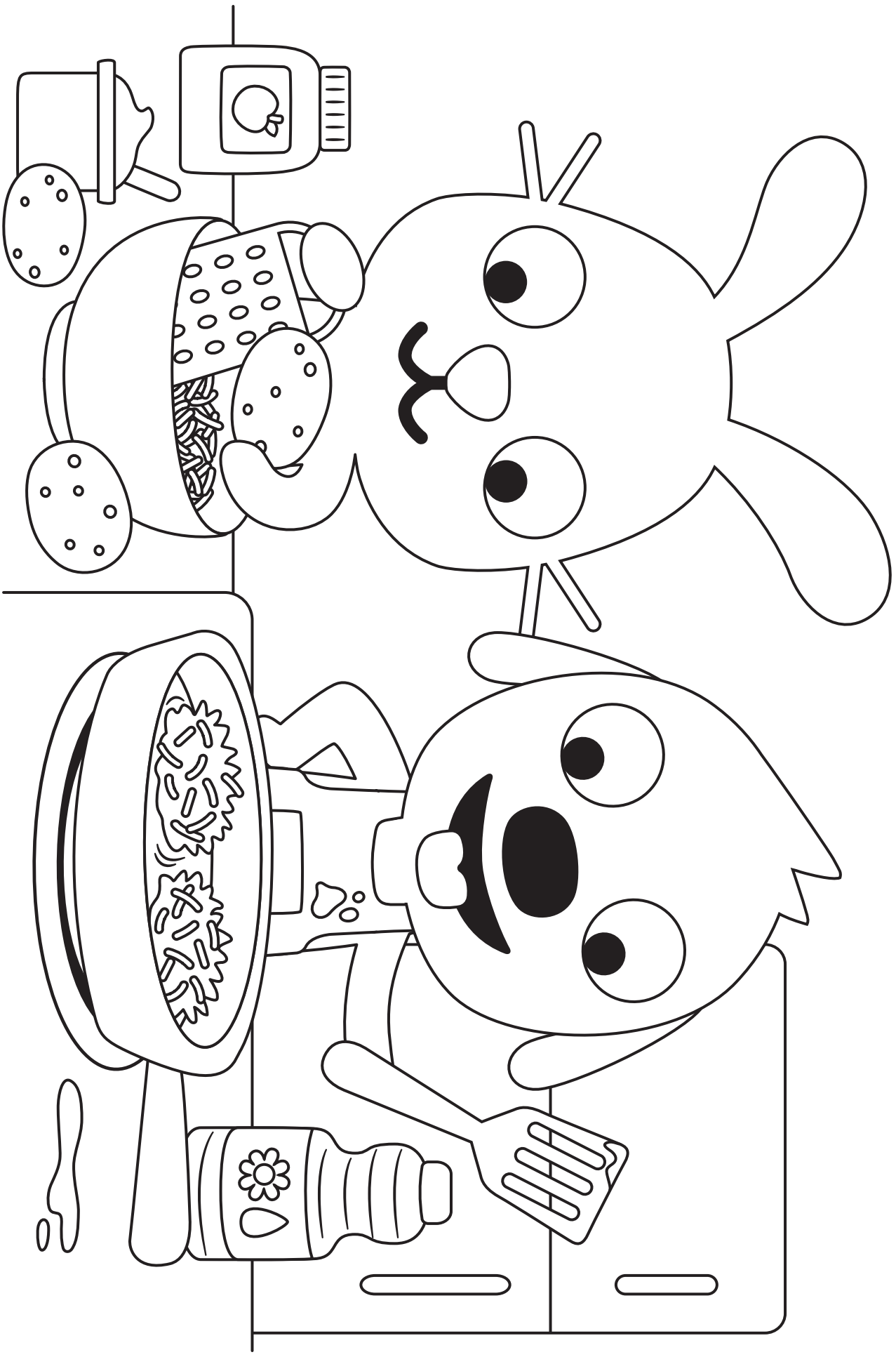


Meet Penny, age 4

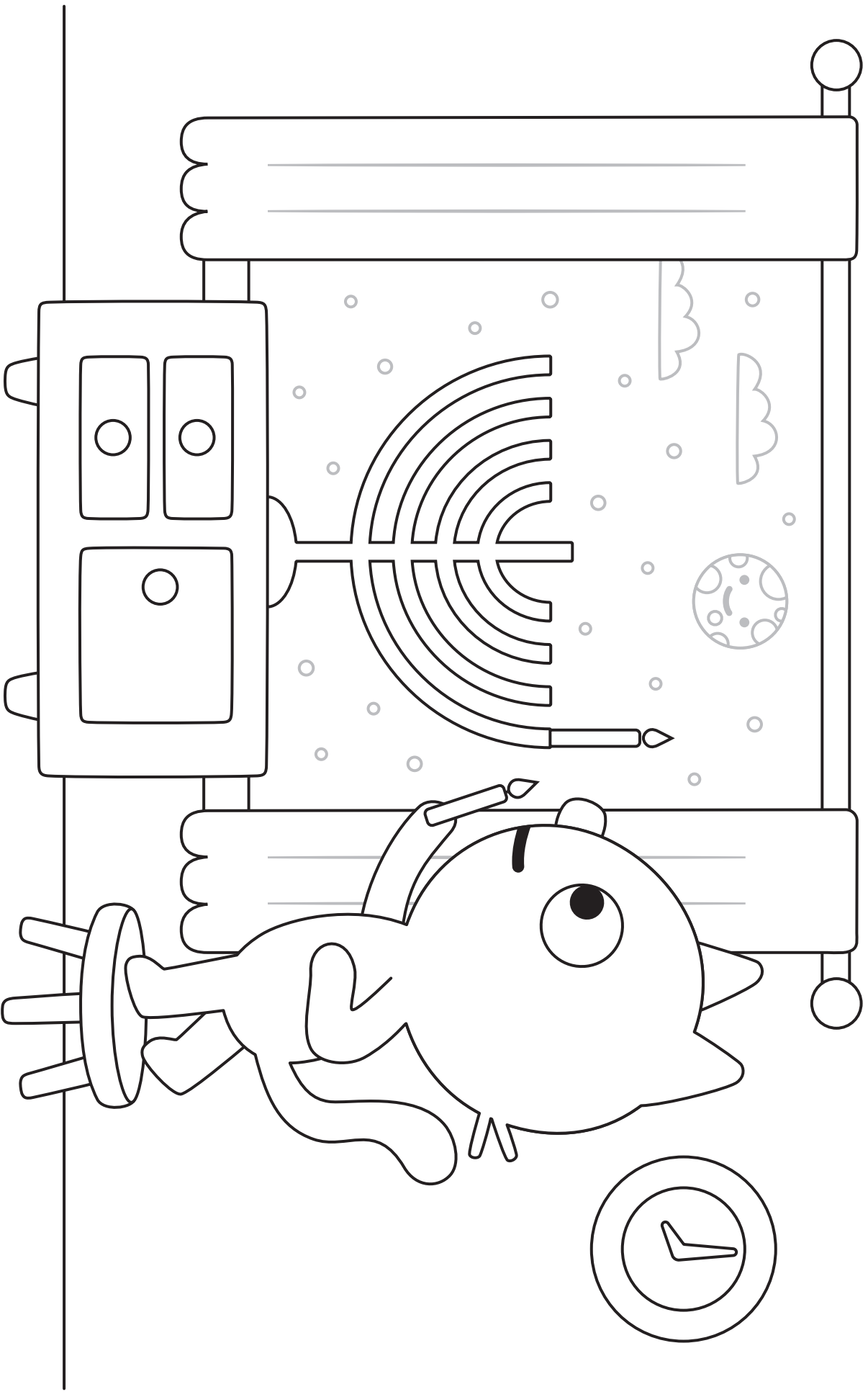




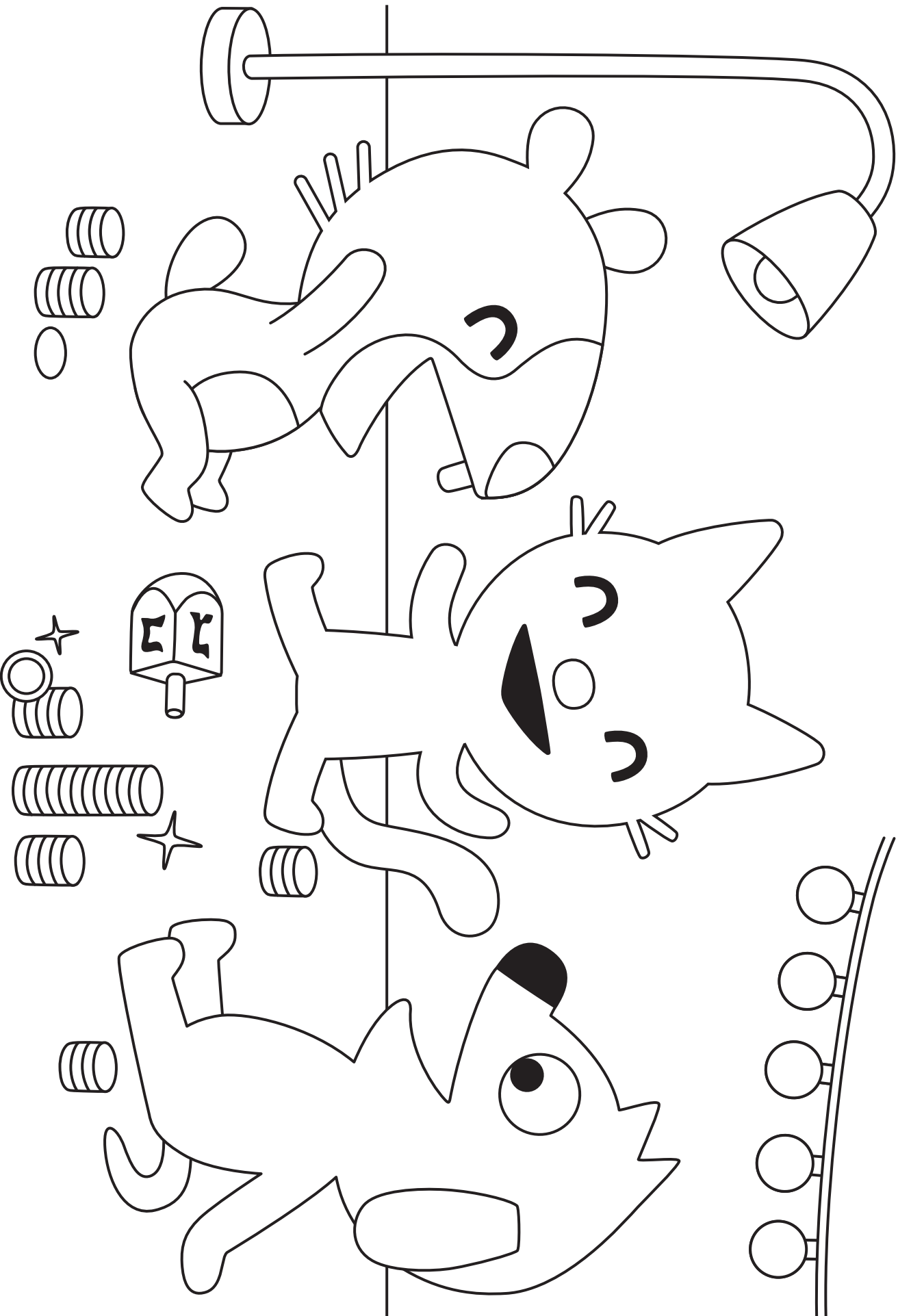

Jack and Harvey are making some fried potato pancakes called latkes to eat during Hanukkah.





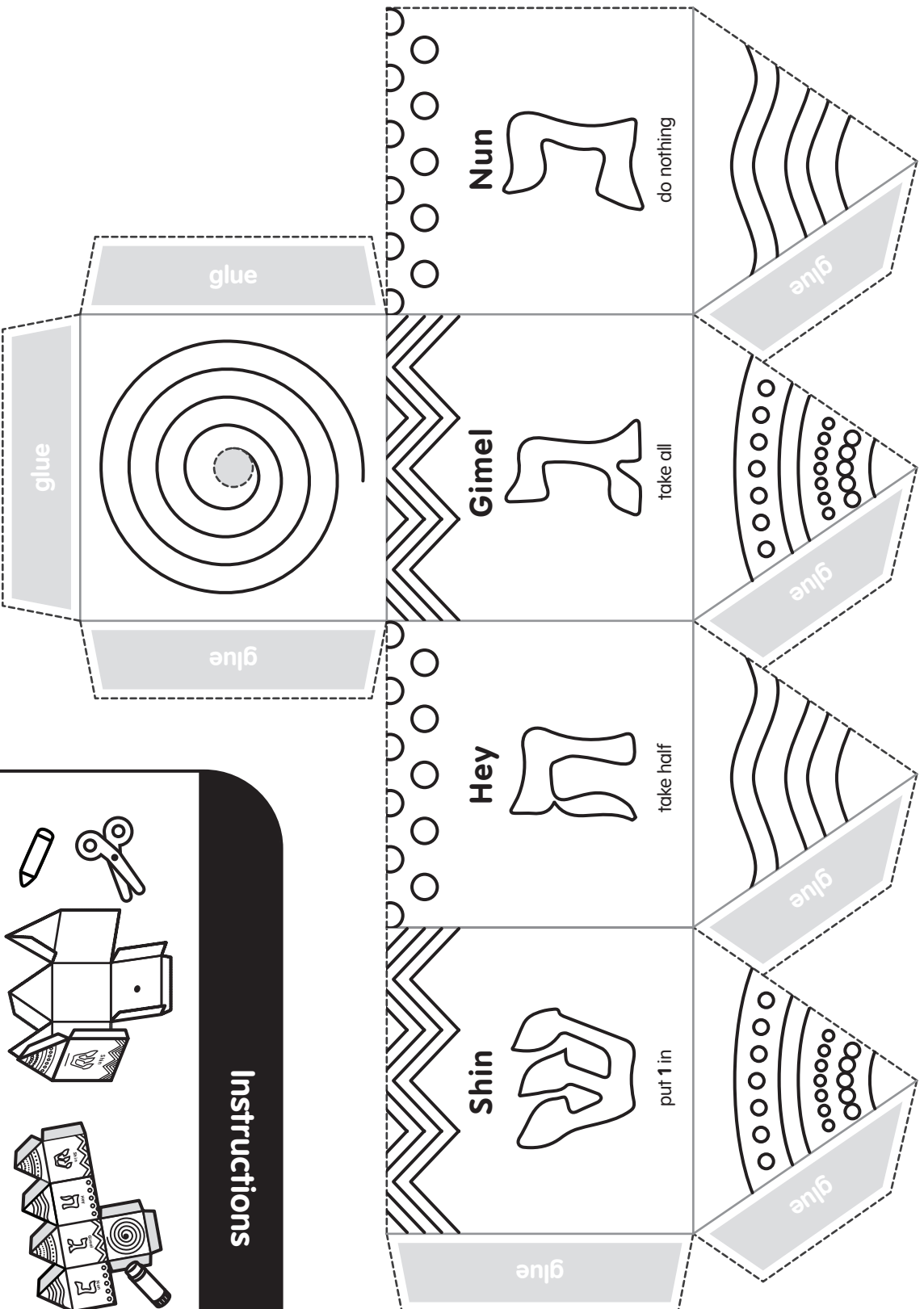
Jinja is lighting a candle on the menorah to celebrate the 1st night of Hanukkah.



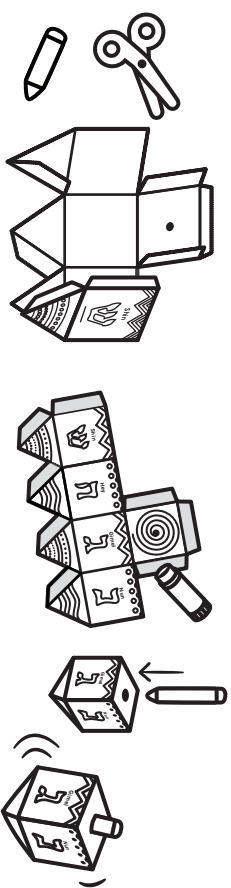
Rosie just won lots of gelt playing with the dreidel!

Instructions



1. Color, cut and fold
 Color in the dreidel. Cut out along the dotted lines and fold along the gray lines.

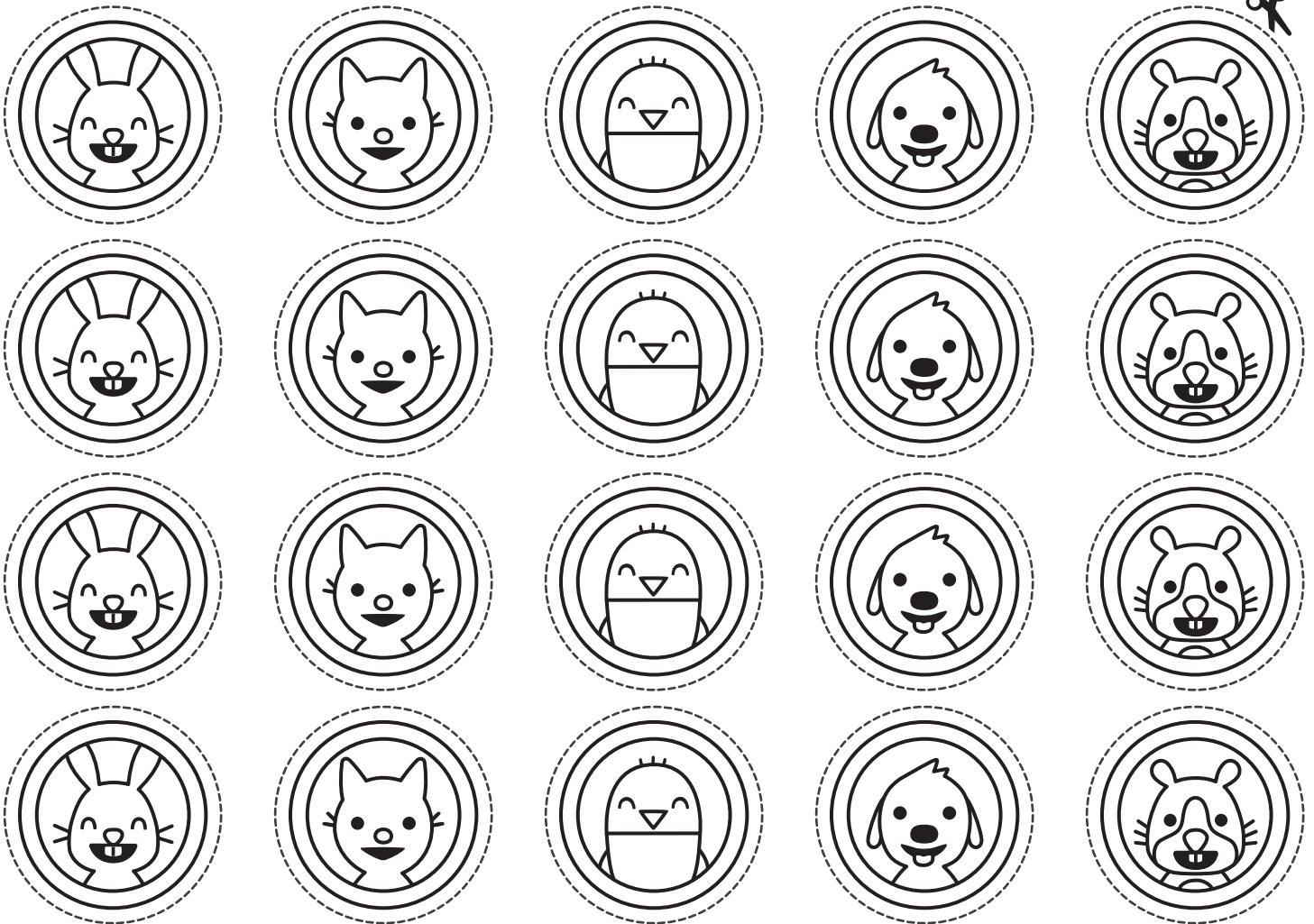
2. Glue and add crayon
 Apply glue onto the tabs and assemble. Push the crayon through the top until it reaches the bottom. Spin the dreidel!

DIY Dreidel

A dreidel is a four-sided spinning top with a Hebrew letter on each side which is used in a children's game traditionally played during Hanukkah.

DIY Gelt

The word "gelt" means "money". Chocolate gelt is given out at Hanukkah and commonly used as game pieces when playing with the dreidel. Many other things can be used, like pennies, dried beans, or make your own gelt below!



Dreidel Game Play Instructions

Set up

All players sit around the playing area.

Divide up the gelt. Each player begins with the same number of gelt (around 10 pieces). Print off additional gelt if needed.

Spin the dreidel to see who goes first.

Nun is highest, then **Gimel**, **Hey**, and **Shin**. Play moves clockwise.

How to play

At the start of each round, everyone puts in one piece into the center.

Each player spins the dreidel at the start of their turn. If the dreidel lands with this side up...

Nun - Do nothing, next player's turn.

Gimel - You get all the pieces in the center!

Hey - You get half of the coins; if the number is odd, round up.

Shin - You have to add a piece to the center.

Collect all the gelt to win!
